ACLS & PALS Recertification Update

A process change is coming for ACLS and PALS recertification.

Staff currently assigned these courses in HealthStream must complete both the online and return demonstration portions by May 30. Beginning June 1, all recertification will shift to a 4-hour in-person class held at the Regional Coordination Center (RCC). Class sign-up will remain available on the Nursing Education Calendar. IT UPDATE Epic Enhancements to Support Your Workflow

We recently updated Epic to the latest version on April 24. Here are some of the new features designed to make documentation faster and more efficient for our nursing team:

- **OPA (OurPractice Advisory):** Best Practice Alerts (BPAs) are now known as OurPractice Advisories (OPA), reflecting a more collaborative approach to clinical decision support.
- **Time-of-Day Checkmarks on AVS:** Checkmarks are now automatically added to the After Visit Summary, saving you extra clicks.
- **Continuous Orders:** Orders with continuous frequencies, such as restraints and telemetry, are now automatically discontinued when they expire.
- ROVER Updates:
 - You can now document education tasks directly from the Brain and Worklist.
 - Complete first dose education documentation more easily at the bedside via the MAR in ROVER.
- Macros are Delivering Greater Efficiency: Nurses saved more than 266,000 clicks in March by using MACROS, which allow you to quickly pull in the most commonly documented data with a single click.
